In addition to the above mentioned riders, a total of max. 15 % of all CSIU25 A athletes may receive a personal invitation from the OC through their NF (Wildcards).

Authorization to participate in the comp. 10: Athletes (18 years and older): see CSIU25-A.

Authorization to participate in the CSIP (competitions 11-13): Pony riders (12 to 16 years old):

Max. 2 ponies per rider.

Foreign Athletes

Pony Riders (aged 12 to 16) from the NFs of AUT, SUI, ITA, FRA, NED, SWE, GBR, HUN, BEL, CZE, POL.

In addition to the above mentioned riders, a total of max. 15 % of all CSIP competitors may receive a personal invitation from the OC through their NF (Wildcards).

Authorization to participate in the CSI Amateurs A+B (comp. 14 – 22)

Admitted Athletes:

1. Approx. 25 foreign Athletes (14 years old or older), who have been invited by the OC through their home NF
2. Approx. 25 German Athletes (14 years old or older), who have been invited by the OC.
3. All Athletes:
 - Number of horses per Athlete: 3 horses of 6 years or over, however, max. 2 horses per competition.
 - The Athlete must be the owner of the horse(s) with which he/she competes. Ownership may be extended to family members.
 - Athletes must have an "Amateur Owner's" license of their respective NF, such a licence will only be granted by NFs to those Athletes who have formally signed a statement that he/she does not earn money for riding other people's horses, giving riding lessons, or for publicity or commercial purposes, etc.
 - An Amateur Owner licence will only be granted by NFs to those Athletes who have formally signed a statement that he/she does not earn money for riding other people's horses, giving riding lessons, or for publicity or commercial purposes, etc.
 - The buying and selling of horses, as well as receiving prize money in cash, are not forbidden providing they do not constitute the competitor's mainly source of income.
 - Holding the "Amateur Owner" status, athletes are not barred from other competitions or Championships. As long as the athlete holds the „Amateur Owner" status, he/she will not be allowed to take part in international or national initial competitions with a height of 1.50 m or greater.

Authorization to participate in the CDIJY (comp. 25 - 30): Juniors (14 to 18 years old)/Young Riders (16 to 21 years old):

Max. 2 horses per athlete .

Foreign Athletes

Juniors/Young Riders (aged 14 to 21) from the NFs of SUI, NED, SWE, GBR, BEL, AUT, DEN, ITA, CZE, POL. The invited NFs may decide which athlete to send. The number of invited athletes per NF is unlimited.

Authorization to participate in the CDIP (comp. 31 - 33): Pony Riders (12 to 16 years old):

Max. 2 ponies per rider .

Foreign Athletes

Pony Riders (12 to 16 years old) from the NFs of AUT, SUI, ITA, FRA, NED, SWE, GBR, HUN, BEL, CZE, POL. The invited NFs may decide which riders to send. The number of invited athletes per NF is unlimited.

**Authorization to participate in the CDIU25 (16-25 years old):
(comp. 23 + 24):**

Invited regional federations/nations as CDIY:

* Foreign competitors: will be invited through their home NF.

Max. 2 horses per athlete; Young Riders 16 and 21 years old may start with two other horses in the CDIY. Horses having been started in the GP YR-test tour may not be started in any other competition of the event. The number of invited athletes per NF is unlimited.

The invited NFs may decide which athletes to send.

Competitors are invited by the Organising Committee through their NF.

One groom per rider.

The organiser draws up a list of all definitely starting competitors („masterlist“), classified according to the above criteria, which must be given to the German NF office, the Foreign Judge and the NF Delegate. Any alterations may only be done in mutual agreement before the event starts.

VI. FACILITIES OFFERED

A) COMPETITORS

Accommodation and meals will be at the competitors' own expense. Hotel reservation has to be made by the NFs or regional federations or competitors themselves. List of hotels see annex.

Limited sites for caravans or live-in-lorries will only be made available if they were booked and paid for (€ 50) at closing date of entries (electricity / toilets / showers).

B) GROOMS

Accommodation and meals will be at the competitors' own expense.

OCs provides sufficient sanitary and showering facilities, with hot and cold water for male and female grooms.

C) HORSES/PONIES

There will be no reimbursement of transport charges.

Horses/ponies taking part in the event have to be stabled on the show grounds in boxes in stable tents from 07/09/2011 to 11/09/2011. Stabling fee (incl. 1st bedding) is included in the entry fee. For shavings, an extra fee of € 25 per box will be charged for waste disposal.

Stables will be made available from Wednesday, 08/09/2011, 12.00 noon.

Own stable tents may not be built up. Horses must not be stabled on lorries.

Additional hay, straw, shavings can be bought at customary prices.

D) WELCOME

For withdrawals after the date of definite entries or no-shows the competitor or the respective NF will be held liable to reimburse the OC for the actual financial loss incurred by the OC (i.e. stabling and hotel expenses) as a result of the late withdrawal or no-show.

VIII. CUSTOMS FORMALITIES/HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

1. CUSTOMS FORMALITIES

For questions pertaining to the veterinary and animal diseases legislation for horses from abroad and regarding the horses' transportation, the OC is ready to assist.

Customs and veterinary fees will not be taken over. For customs and veterinary formalities for horses from abroad, the OC charges 35 EUR per horse.

2. HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR THE ENTRY OF HORSES

Every competitor is supplied to deliver all necessary certificates of health for the transport to the event or identification of the horses before they come into the stables:

- a) in case of arrival from a EU-member-country, a certificate for registered horses acc. to sample of Annex B to Reglements 90/426 of the actual valid form will be necessary.
- b) in case of arrival from a country not concerning to the EU, a certificate of health for registered horses acc. to sample of annex II of the decision of the commission 92/260 of the actual valid form will be necessary.

A certificate must be done in at least one official language of the country of destination and in one official language of the member country. The competitor must carry with him the original certificate, not a copy.

The organiser sees to it that on the competition site, an official state veterinarian is present to issue the health certificates which are necessary for the transport of the horses to their destination abroad.

In case the OC has entrusted to a forwarding agency, the latter is ready to assist regarding the required documents.

Furthermore, questions relating to health requirements for horses can be directed to the veterinary authorities in the country of origin or in Germany.

VETERINARY REGULATIONS, 12th Edition, 5th April 2010, updates effective 1st January 2011.

VETERINARY EXAMINATIONS, HORSE INSPECTIONS & PASSPORT CONTROLS

These will be carried out in accordance with the "Veterinary Regulations", Art. 1011 & the discipline rules.

"General Regulations", 23rd edition, effective 1st January 2009, updates effective 1st January 2011:

PASSPORTS (ART. 137)

1. Every Horse entered for any Competition at CNs or CIMs (see Appendix E) and in CSI-P and CSI-Ch-A in a country other than the country of the Horse's nationality, and all Horses entered for other CIs, CIOs, FEI Championships, Regional, Olympic Games and Paralympic Games, whether at home or away from the country of its nationality (see Article 139.2), must have an official, valid FEI passport, or a national passport approved by the FEI and accompanied by an FEI Recognition Card and, when applicable, must be registered with the FEI, as a means of identification and to establish ownership.

2. Horses taking part in CNs and CIMs (see Appendix E) and in CSI-P and CSI-Ch-A in their country of nationality are not required to have such a passport as is mentioned in paragraph 1. All such Horses must be properly registered with the FEI and identifiable and, unless there is no national requirement for equine influenza vaccination in the host country and in the country of origin all Horses must have a valid vaccination certificate.

EQUINE INFLUENZA VACCINATION, VET. REGS. ANNEX VI

(except events taking place in NZL & AUS)

From 1 January 2005 onwards, influenza vaccination for all horses competing in FEI competitions requires a vaccination within six months + 21 days of the competition.

1. All horses intending to participate in FEI competition must have at least received an initial primary course of two vaccinations, given between 21 and 92 days apart. Thereafter, a third dose (referred to as the first booster) must be given within 7 months after the date of administration of the second primary dose, with at least annual boosters given subsequently (i.e. within one year of the last dose).

2. If the horse is scheduled to take part in an FEI competition, the last booster must have been given within 6 months + 21 days of arrival at the FEI event. (The 21-day window has been provided to enable vaccination requirements to fit in with the competition schedule).

3. No vaccination shall be given within 7 days of the day of arrival at the FEI event.

4. All horses that were certified as correctly vaccinated under the previous FEI equine influenza vaccination rule prior to 1st January 2005, do not need to start a primary course again provided that they have complied with the previous rule of primary course and annual re-vaccinations and the new rule of a booster vaccination within 6 months + 21 days of the day of arrival at the FEI event.

SAMPLING FOR PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES (Vet. Regs. Art. 1016.4)

Regular sampling is carried out in CCI3*/4*, CSIs (3*, 4*, 5*), CIOs, World Cup Qualifiers and Finals, Championships and Games, whereas at other CIs sampling is recommended. When testing takes place, the number of horses tested is at the discretion of the Testing Veterinarian/Veterinary Delegate. At CCI3* and CCI4*, CSIs (3*, 4*, 5*), CIOs, World Cup Qualifiers and Cup Finals, Championships and Games it is recommended that a minimum of 5% of all horses (with a minimum of 3 horses tested) must be sampled (see also VR Art. 1016.5.).

Special guidelines are applicable for events covered by the FEI Medication Control Programme (Groups I & II only).

MEDICATION CONTROL PROGRAMME (GROUP I & II ONLY)

The Organising Committees of FEI events within Groups I & II are advised to charge Athletes the equivalent of CHF 12.50 per horse per event as a contribution towards the costs of the MCP programme.

MEDICATION CONTROL LABORATORY

X. MISCELLANEOUS

1. PROTESTS

All protests to be valid must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of CHF 150.- or equivalent.

2. PRIZE-GIVING CEREMONY

The 6 best dressage riders in each competition and the 8 best jumping riders in each competition are asked to attend the prize-giving ceremony.

The owner of the winning horse is invited to the prize giving ceremony for the Grand Prix (comp. 6).

3. Distribution of Prizes and Indemnities

All prize money and all prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money as well as reimbursements (e. g. transport charges, travelling expenses) will be distributed acc. to FEI-RG Art. 127/128 following the last competition at the latest. The scheduled prizes are gross amounts.

Settlement will be done per athlete. Depending on the agreement with the horse owner, each athlete binds himself to pass on to the horse owners the prize money or prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money. The organizer is allowed to deduct possibly outstanding debts of the athlete.

Acc. to § 50a EstG this also applies to foreign horse owners. After having deducted the VAT from the prize money or prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money, as a rule the following income tax will be due: no taxes up to 250 EUR, 15 % exceeding 250 EUR (in force as of 01.01.2009); plus solidarity fee (at present 5.5 %) of the income amount. Travelling expenses being taken over or reimbursed are only regarded as revenues if they exceed the actual costs and the reimbursement for additional meal allowances acc. to § 4 Abs. 5 Satz 1 Nr. 5 EstG. The tax deduction has to be certified on demand. Those foreign athletes being exempted from tax deduction are kindly asked to submit an exemption certificate either with the entry or on the first show day at the latest. Every athlete himself is responsible for the correctness of the details he submits.

4. INSURANCES

All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

5. LIABILITY

The organizer declines any liability for property or pecuniary damage which may happen to visitors, athletes, grooms and horse owners through slight negligence of the organizer, his delegates or his assistants. The OC is liable in case of intent, gross negligence as well as in case of injury to life, body or health and in further cases he is liable for compelling legal liability acc. to the legal requirements. Furthermore he also declines any liability for theft or other incidents.

6. EVENT'S ORGANISATION

In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of the Delegate of the NF GER, Chefs d'Equipe and Ground Jury the OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matter or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes must be notified to all competitors and officials as soon as possible and must be reported to the FEI Jumping or Dressage Department by the Foreign Judge.

Closing time of declaration for all competitions will be 7:00 p. m. of the previous day.

9. SCHOOLING DURING COMPETITIONS

Riders wishing to school during speed competitions (Table A and Table C) must inform the OC before these competitions begin. These riders will start first in these competitions.

10. TRAINING

Horses/ponies may only be trained on horseback by the rider, riding the horse in the respective competition. Training only with identification numbers.

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.
